Dear Liz,

I have the great pleasure to inform you that you have been chosen by the WCM Board of Directors to be the 2018 inductee into the WCM Hall of Fame! Each year, WCM recognizes and inducts one community media professional who has shown great leadership and devotion to the mission of public, education, and government access television -- "empowering people to create media for human purposes." Your more than 30 years of dedication to the cause of access is one to be proud of and one WCM is very pleased to recognize.

You started as a public access television professional when the field was just being defined. In 1985, the landmark 1984 federal Cable Act was new when the Village of Oregon decided to form a non-profit organization, the Oregon Community Foundation, to use the local cable access channel to cover the schools, the village, and the community at large. Your community connections made you the kind of person the Village was looking for – someone who was committed to the community, had a lot of energy, and was willing to learn video to bring the community to life on TV.

Working out of a closet in Village Hall, you gathered together a group of high school students who were eager to play with cameras and microphones to record school events and games on tape. Parents started to get involved, too. They saw the value in recording the important events in their children's lives. With this group, you also covered government meetings and community events, and the profile of the channel grew.

As a member of Inter-Comm of Southern Wisconsin in the 1980's and 1990's, you shared program ideas, explored equipment options, hosted production workshops and built relationships with other communities doing access, too.

In 2005, OCA finally emerged from the closet and moved to Market Street. Still working as a part-time director, you had added a couple more part-time employees to help run the station. Many students had come in and out your door, learning valuable skills that would serve them for life. One of the high school kids loved doing production so much he decided to go to school for it. And that kid, Tim Olsen, returned to Oregon to bring a valuable set of skills to the station and help move it firmly into the

digital sphere. And that same kid is receiving a top Excellence Award in the Best of the Midwest Media Fest for his program, "Welcome Home to Oregon" this year. You must be very proud of him!

At your retirement in late 2016, you didn't just walk out the door. You made sure the new manager, Paul Zwicker, had the reins firmly in hand before you did. You stayed to help with the transition and to make sure that after thirty years, the station you had built and nurtured was going to be just fine.

We will be recognizing your contribution to community television and to the Village of Oregon by inducting you into the WCM Hall of Fame at the Best of the Midwest Media Fest Banquet and Show on Thursday, May 10 at the Best Western Premier Waterfront Hotel & Convention Center in Oshkosh. There are two tickets reserved for you and a guest. Oregon Cable Access Media will receive the traveling Hall of Fame plaque with your name added to display proudly during the coming year.
